- Gain hands-on experience in government offices, governmental agencies, advocacy groups or international organizations.
- Be paired with mentors who help shape policy, providing unparalleled insight into the inner workings of government, diplomacy and NGOs.
- Attend weekly workshops with elected officials, lobbyists and communal leaders to develop your skills as an effective advocate.
- Receive a \$2,150 stipend upon successful completion of the program.
